

What Jesus says to the unsaved

Trial 2. Mark 14:61-62

Luke 9:18-20 'Who do you say I am?'

Jesus wants the unsaved to know He is

Logic pathway: Only can save. Isaiah 43:10b-11

Only is God. Titus 2:13, 2 Peter 1:1

Only Jesus can John 14:6

Jesus is the Saviour the world.

1 John 2:1-2 '...not ours only, but the sins of the whole world.'

1 John 4:14 '...Saviour of the world.'

Jesus is **my** Saviour the world.

Colossians 1:13 '...out from within... and transferred us into...'

Jesus wants the unsaved to know He is

Revelation 3:21 'I conquered and sat down with My Father on His throne.'

Logic pathway: My Saviour is in Heaven; therefore, my salvation is in Heaven.

My salvation is in Heaven.

The record for

Luke 10:20 'rejoice that your names are written in Heaven.'

The record for

Revelation 20:15 'anyone whose name was not... was thrown into...'

My salvation is in Heaven.

1 Peter 1:3-4 '...reserved in Heaven for you.'

I am the custodian of my own salvation.

Jesus wants the unsaved to know He is

John 3:16-17 '...to save the world...' Acts 1:11 '...will come back...'

1 Peter 4:4-5 '...they will have to give an account to Him... the Judge...'

The time of grace is for a

2 Corinthians 6:2 'In the *season* of favour I heard you...'

The time of judgement is a

Revelation 10:6-7 '...no longer be *time*.' 1 Cor.15:51-52, 1 Thess.4:16-17

2 Timothy 4:1-2 'I charge you... Christ Jesus who will judge... Therefore...'

Thought starters for personal reflection or group study

1. What do you find are your top three reasons why it is sometimes difficult to talk with unbelievers about Jesus?
2. The High Priest knew the key question to ask (Mark 14:61). What are some implications of how that question is answered?
3. For whom did Jesus die (1 John 2:1-2, 1 John 4:14)? Does this include Adolf Hitler and Saddam Hussein? What impact might this have on me as I speak with the unsaved?
4. Colossians 1:13 presents two effects of salvation. Why do I need both?
5. What is the action step from Luke 10:20? Why should I do that; and then what other actions naturally flow from this first one?
6. Read 1 Peter 1:4-5. Why should non-Christians have to give an account to Christ?
7. Read 2 Timothy 4:1-2. What is the rationale (v1), and the requirements (v2), for believers? What does each element look like, in practice?
