4. Romans 1:16 says, “I am not ashamed of the Gospel”. Why do you think some Christians are embarrassed about their faith? Suggest a few ways that they might overcome their embarrassment.
5. The sermon included a sample conversation: “The Bible is full of mistakes and contradictions!” “How interesting. Please show me one of them. The Bible says God loves you. That’s not a mistake.” When someone gives these negative statements, what answer might you give to turn the conversation in a more positive direction?
