Thought starters for personal reflection or group discussion

1. Under what circumstances did you first hear about Jesus; and under what circumstances did you decide to commit your life to Him?
2. John the Baptist said of Jesus, "Look..." v36. Jesus said to Andrew, "Come and see," v39. Philip said to Nathanael "Come and see," v46. Why do you think Jesus invites them into an experience/relationship rather than giving them a theological lecture or a roadmap?
3. Jesus asked His followers, "What do you want?" Why is this a powerful question?
4. Jesus looks at Simon, v42, and instantly renames him Cephas (Peter/Rocky/Pebbles). What is the significance of Jesus defining our identity based on who we will become in Him, rather than who we are when we first meet Him?
5. When Nathanael heard about Jesus, he was cynical and sceptical, v46. Why did Philip not take 'No' for an answer? What is a step we can take when we first receive 'No' for an answer?
6. Why is a personal recommendation and an invitation the best form of advertising?
