For personal reflection or group discussion

- 1. Read Genesis 21:1-2. What do those verses tell you about God's character? Which aspects of God's character do you most appreciate?
- 2. Read 2 Peter 3:9, remembering it was written to Christians. What does this verse require of Christians in relation to God, self and others?
- 3. What are signs of maturity according to Hebrews 5:13-14? What makes growth increasingly easier?
- 4. What did God promise for Ishmael in Genesis 21:13, but what made that promise hard to fulfil, Genesis 16:12? What human elements work against God's promises in your life?
- 5. Read Genesis 21:16-19. What are some lessons we can learn about prayer being answered?
- 6. Hagar lived among the Hebrews and adopted their ways, but she never gave up her Egyptian heart (Gen.16:1,3, 21:9, 25:12). Eventually she tied her son to that same past (Gen.21:21). What warnings does this convey to good, church-going folk today?
