3. What is the positive and encouraging statement in this verse? How does it offer hope and optimism?
4. Jesus' actions are just as bold as His words. He intervened to solve the presenting problem, and He turned the incident into a teaching opportunity in 9:42-44. Why, and how, did He solve the problem Himself; and b) What did He hope the disciples would learn?
5. Read James 4:2-3. What are some key lessons for effective prayer?
6. Suggest reasons why the incident ends the way it does, in Luke 9:45?
