My Prayer Points for this week

For personal reflection, or group discussion

1. What was your wildest, most outrageous plan ever? Did it even come close to fruition?
2. Read Mark 10:32. What attitudes were displayed by everyone, and why did they act/feel that way? What did Jesus do to help the others?
3. Jesus told them the plan - read Mark 10:33-34. In what circumstances does it help when you know the plan? Are there circumstances where you would rather not know the plan? Why do you think God has told us the broad sweep of His plan, but not the specific details?
4. Read John 6:33. Why is peace optional, but trouble is certain? What can I do to increase peace?
5. Review the 6 references stating God's will for my life, then combine all of them into a single statement, "God's will for my life is..."
6. How does the plan conclude, Revelation 11:15? What is our part in bringing the plan to fruition, Revelation 12:11?
