2. Review these 2 similar promises: Matthew 28:20 & Hebrews 13:5. Even though Jesus is always with us, what are the 3 main reasons why you forget this fact? What is one helpful thing that a good friend would advise you to solve this problem?
3. What was the unnecessary problem the 2 travellers inflicted on themselves (Luke 24:21a)? What leads us to unrealistic expectations? What godly characteristics help overcome this problem?
4. What caused the travellers' sadness (Luke 24:11)? Dig deeper; what do you think caused those causes? What could they do to prevent, or to reverse, those causes you just listed?
5. Instead of showing His wounds and saying "Tadaa", what did Jesus do to help the travellers (Luke 24:27)? Why do you think He chose Option B rather than "Tadaa"? What similar approach can we adopt today?
