- 3. How much time does it take to introduce a change into your life? What slows down the changes we need to make? And how can we speed up the positive changes we want to see?
- 4. Read 2 Corinthians 6:1-2. This was written to those who are already saved, so what is meant by "now is the day of salvation"? Suggest ways we apply each aspect of these verses more fully?
- 5. Read Psalm 90:12. How does the first half of this verse relate to the second half? How can we do the first half in better ways?
- 6. One of Jesus' favourite sayings was "The Kingdom of God is near" (eg Mark 1:15). What does the Kingdom look like on Monday?
